Class History

In the fall of 1940, ten mares and five stallions were rounded into the first grade corral. They were: Lyle Aasheim, Charles Christianson, Clara Demory, Barbara De Smidt, Duane Dippel, Patricia Foley, Isabelle Johnson, Roy Johnson, Bonnie Hoversten, Irene Mitsven, Stanley Nelson, Phyllis Norman, Nancy Olson, Ruth Rood, and Shirley Rood. Ellen Brechner was the instructor to break us wild broncs.

After a three month vacation to the pasture we trotted across the hall to Second grade. We lost Duane Dippel, Patricia Foley, and Isabelle Johnson. A new colt, Morton Christianson, was waiting to be let in. This made thirteen saddles hanging on the wall. We were kept in training with Myrtle Lerud as our guide.

Our Third grade training was continued by Myrtle Lerud, and we added Janice Olson and lost Shirley and Ruth Rood. That left only twelve stalls filled.

We remained in the same room under the same guidance throughout the Fourth grade. As we galloped on Charles and Morton Christianson were left behind. We gained Jean and June Longauger and Yvonne Abens.

Upon returning this year, 1944, we were transferred across the hall into the Fifth grade. We found ourselves with a new teacher, Ivanell Larson. Again we were unfortunate by losing June and Jean Longauger and Roy Johnson, but before long Elwood Kinseth joined us. We are now eleven.

As we paced on, Norma Saathoff entered Sixth grade in the second semester. Elwood Kinseth and Duane Dippel took their saddles and left. Ivanell Larson remained our instructor.

Advancing into the Seventh grade Marion Helland called our attention to something new called the monitor system. This was to prepare us for our high school years. We were fascinated by this system. It also meant some lower grades. Phyllis Norman moved to Chicago, but we added Truman Jordahl. Now we are ten.

This was a happy year just thinking about Eighth grade graduation and high school. Marion Helland remained our teacher throughout the Eighth grade. Yvonne Abens decided not to remain with us, but we admitted five new pupils, Charlotte and Clarence Hanson, Bennett Hemmestad, Doris Olson, and Conrad Rolland. We graduated from the Eighth grade in the spring of 1948.

Shyly we marched up to the second floor and selected sixteen seats in the Freshman's rows. We were: Lyle Aasheim, Clara Demory, Charlotte Hanson, Clarence Hanson, Bennett Hemmestad, Bonnie Hoversten, Truman Jordahl, Irene Mitsven, Stanley Nelson, Phyllis Norman, Doris Olson, Janice Olson, Nancy Olson, Conrad Rolland, Norma Saathoff, and Robert Torgerson. Luckily, we survived the tortures and perils of initiation, which were not as bad as we expected. Our class sponsor was Mr. Dale Vige.

We climbed another step of the ladder to our Sophomore year. We were given the opportunity of initiating the Freshmen. This, of course, made us feel quite superior. Our Sophomore year, we neither lost nor gained students. Again Mr. Dale Vige was chosen as our sponsor. This year we presented a one act play, "She was Only a Farmer's Daughter".

On entering our Junior year we were joined by Lloyd Dageforde, who came from Paola, Kansas. This year kept us busy as bees. We gave our class play, "Rest Assured", under the appreciated direction of Mr. Dale Vige. Mrs. Dale Vige was chosen as our sponsor since we were putting on the Junior-Senior banquet this year. With our theme as "Hawaii" the banquet was a success. In the latter part of the year Clarence Hanson and Truman Jordahl left us.

On August 27, 1951, we took the part of being distinguished Seniors, the upperclassmen of old Bode High. On October 2, 1951, we took a little trip to Storm Lake to have our graduation pictures taken. Since Clarence Hanson quit school last year he will be unable to graduate with us. We lost Janice Olson at the end of the first semester. Our class will be the first to graduate from the new gymnasium. We are looking forward to our Skip Day, class play, and Junior-Senior Banquet. On May 14, 1952, fourteen Seniors will graduate from Bode High School. They will be: Lyle Aasheim, Lloyd Dageforde, Clara Demory, Charlotte Hanson, Benny Hemmestad, Bonnie Hoversten, Irene Mitsven, Stanley Nelson, Phyllis Norman, Doris Olson, Nancy Olson, Conrad Rolland, Norma Saathoff, and Robert Torgerson. Mr. Wendell Schar is our sponsor.

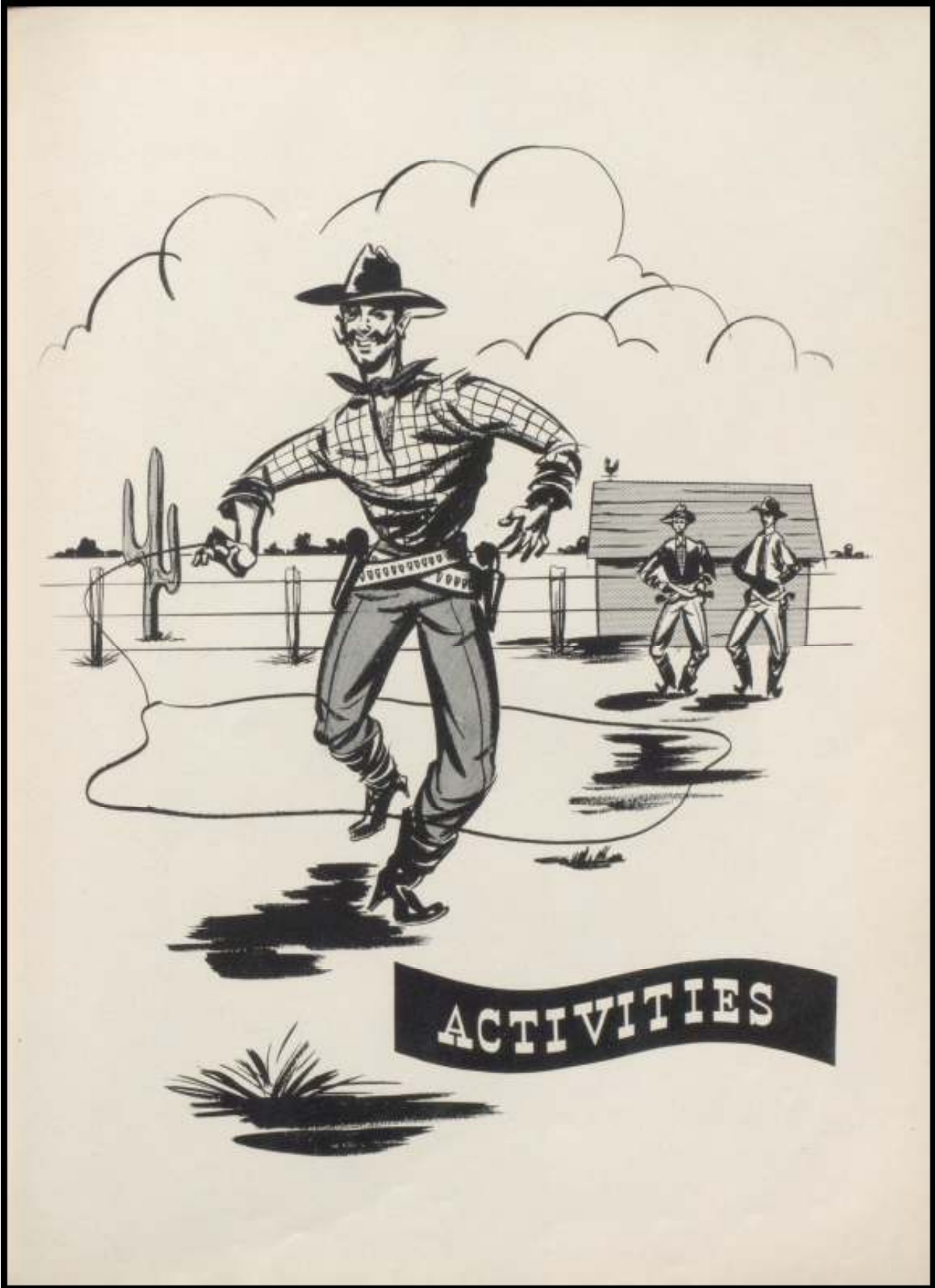

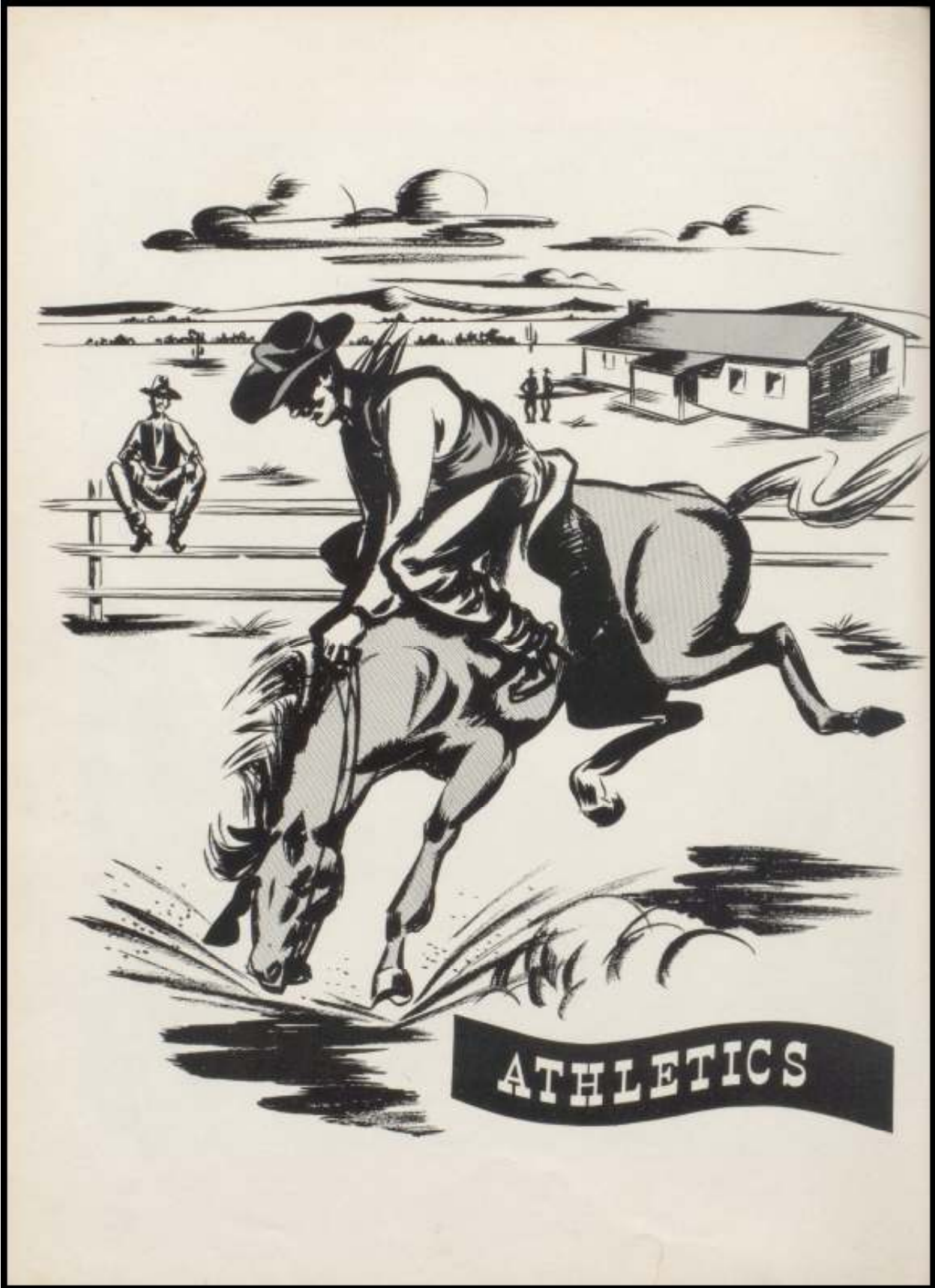

Sports Summary

The sport's season at Bode High began August 24th, 1951, when Coach Norman Theiss called the first practice of the football team. Three weeks later they went on the field for the first game against Mason City, sporting their new orange and black uniforms. This game was played under the lights on our new athletic field. The season moved along rapidly through an eight game schedule climaxed by the home-coming game with the Graettinger eleven. The best game of the year was a hard-fought 7 to 0 victory over Lytton.

Basketball started the first week of November with the boys and girls both holding daily practices. The first game for the boys was a convincing victory over St. Joe and the girls opened their season at Vernon. The first part of the season was a little disappointing but after a few games the teams got rolling and turned in good records. January 8th we opened our new gymnasium with a sell-out crowd that saw us split a twin bill with Goldfield. The boy's team won second place in the Little Nine tournament, finished fourth in the Boone Valley Conference and ended with a 16 and 10 record. The girls got beat out in the consolation round of the sectional tournament and finished in sixth place in the Boone Valley Conference.

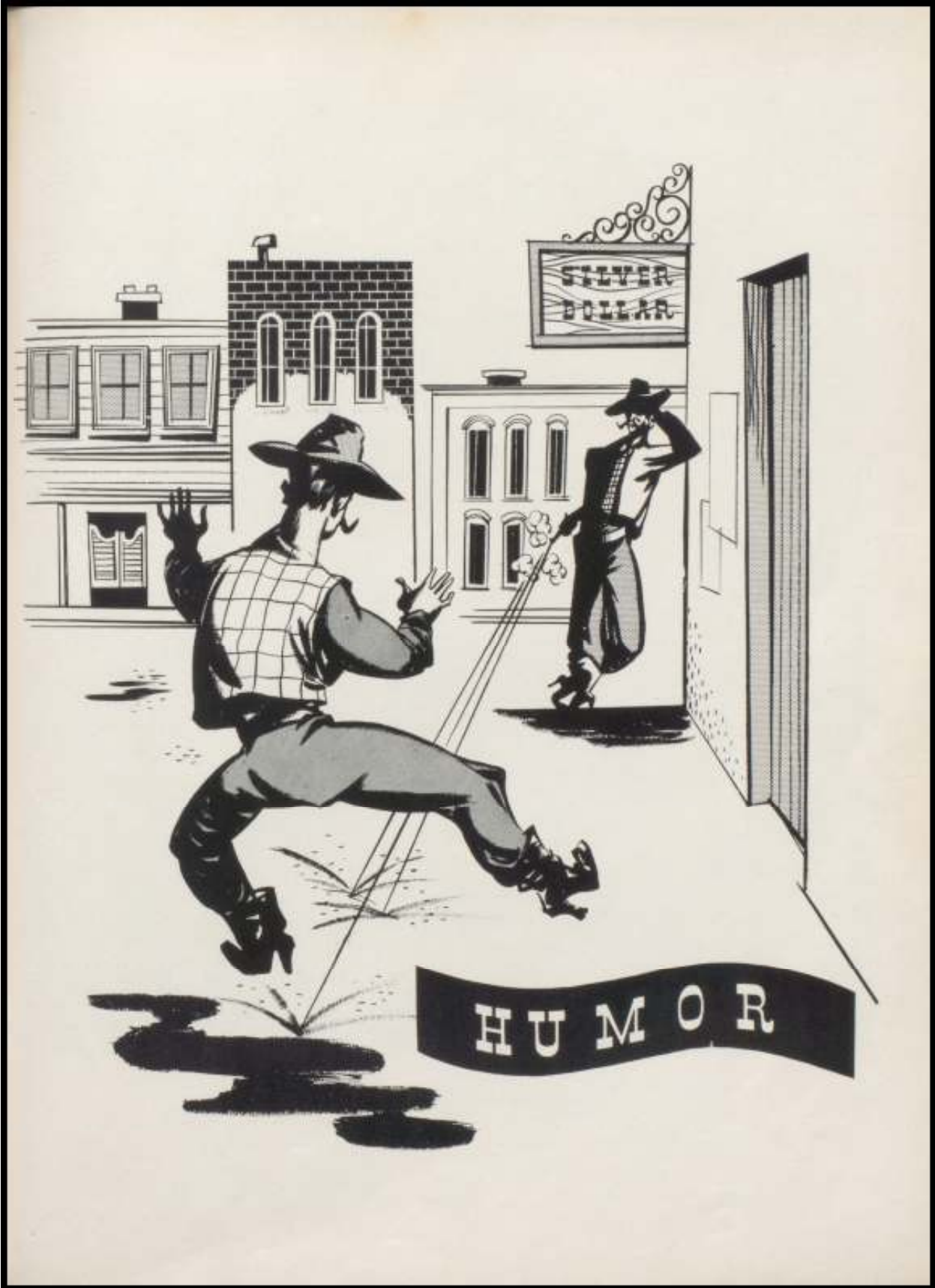

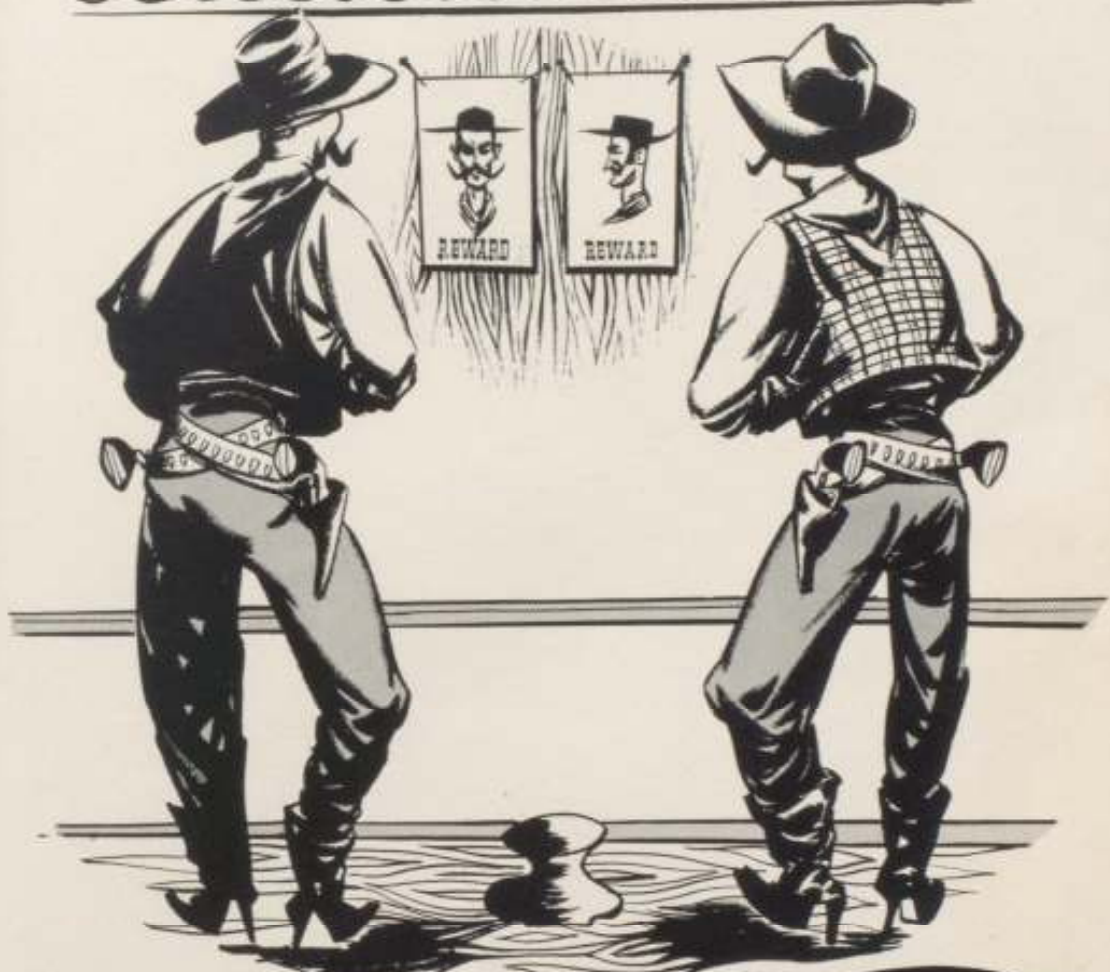

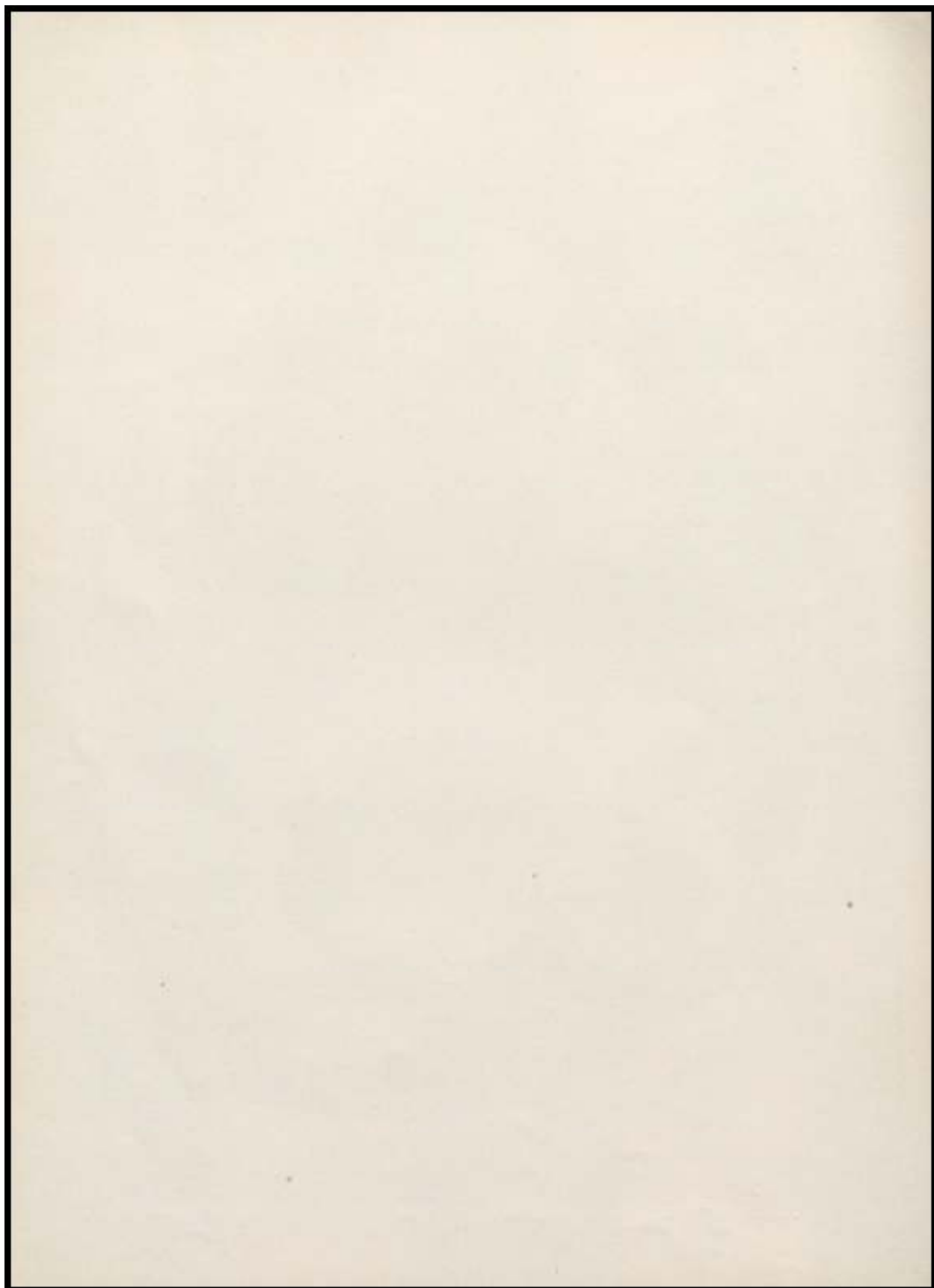
