1. **DRAFT LOTTERY** — The first draft lottery in 27 years was held on December 1st, at Selective Service headquarters in Washington. Captives containing days of the year were picked and by year listed the order for the next year's draft.
2. **AN OSCAR FOR HER FIRST MOVIE** — Bette Midler was an Oscar for her performance in "Fanny Hill." She and Katherine Hepburn were named year's best actresses.
3. **A NEW SWAIN FOR PEACE** — Every conceivable type of penetrator occurred in Vietnam. Manifested Day in October, in Lincoln, Massachusetts, the townsfolk gathered for an unforgettable candle service.
4. **TOWNSEND WHICH 'EV' COME HOME** — A hearse bearing the body of the late Senator Everett M. Dirksen moved through Pekin, Illinois enroute to the cemetery.
5. **INDIANAPOLIS 500** — Mario Andretti received congratulatory letters from car owner Gusman for his record speed of 168.218 MPH in the 300 mile race. Andretti's race 300 beats the mark of 167.8 mph set by a crash and fire during last year's race. (May '81)
6. **EPIDEMIOLOGICAL INVESTIGATION OF AIDS** — Tony Danza and his 17-year-old bride, the former Victoria Beckham, were on the stage of the Johnny Carson show in New York City. The couple was married on the program.

**KENNEDY'S ATTEND FUNERAL** — Sen. Edward M. Kennedy follows his wife, Joan into St. Vincent's church in Plymouth, Pennsylvania, to attend funeral service for May 16 Representative. Miss Kaposchke died in an auto mishap from which Sen. Kennedy escaped. (July '68)

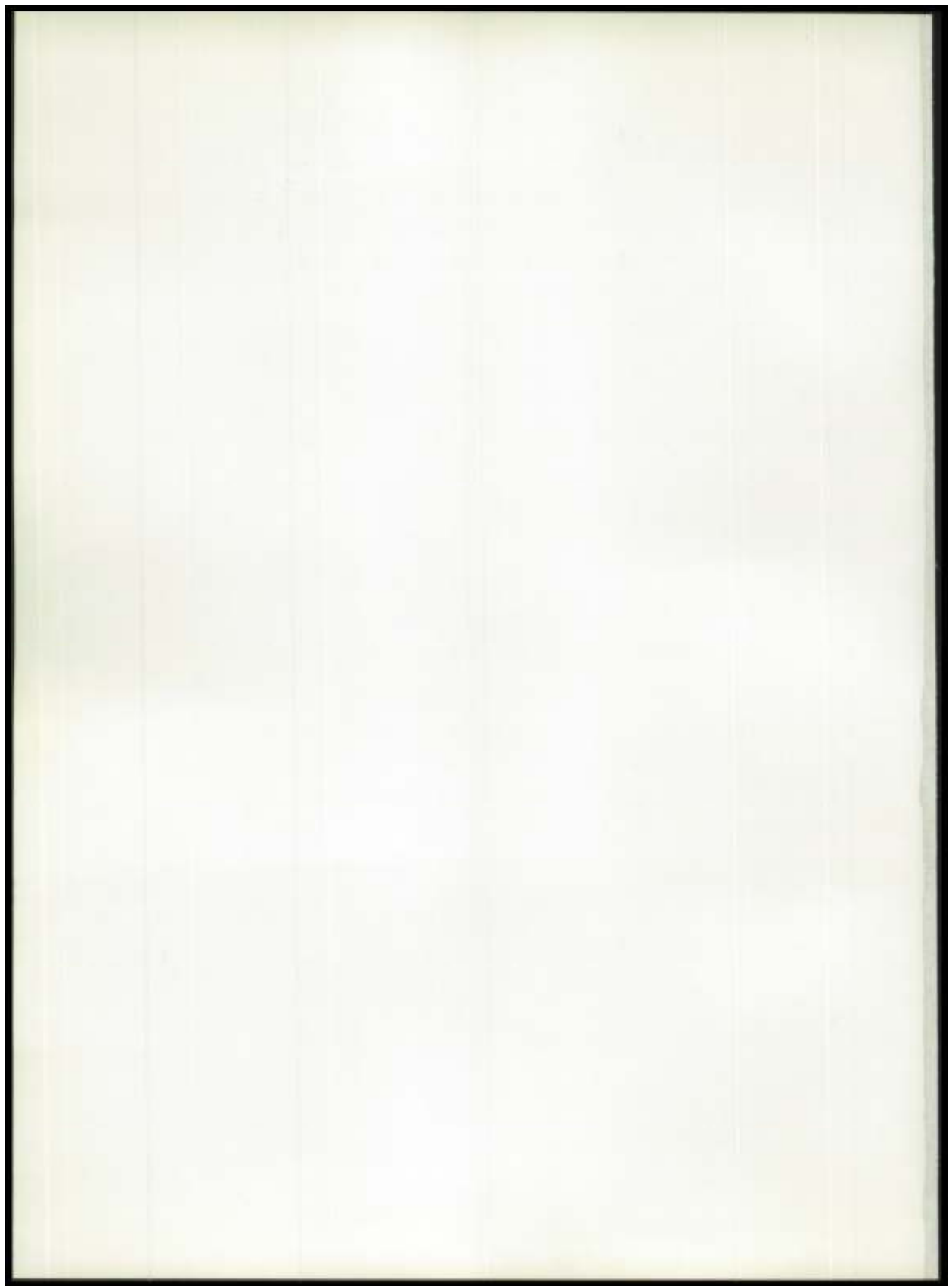

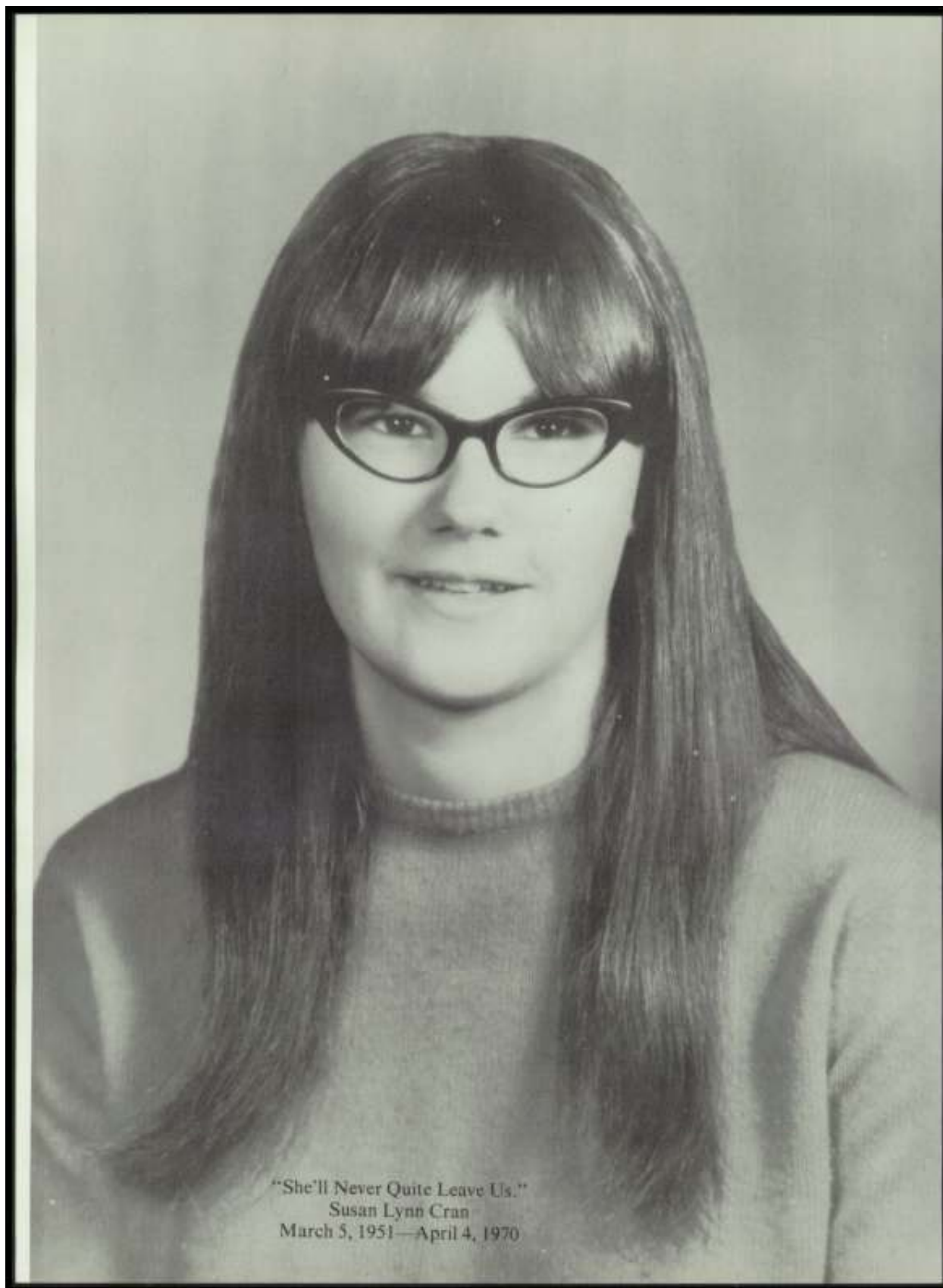

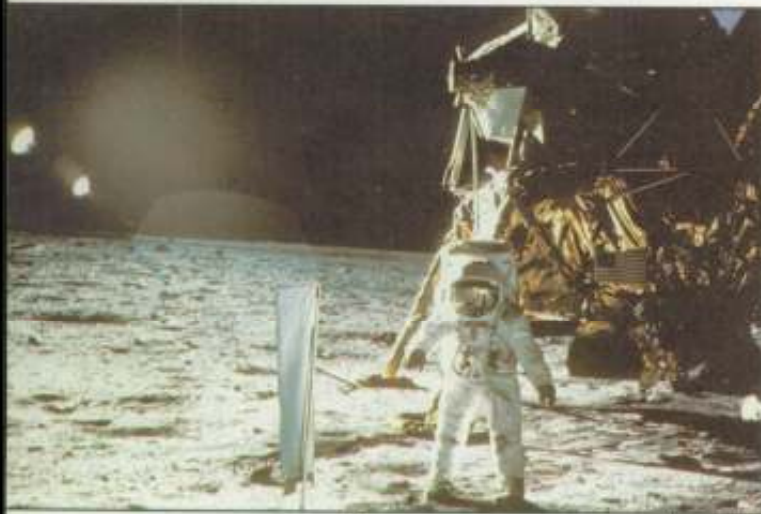
