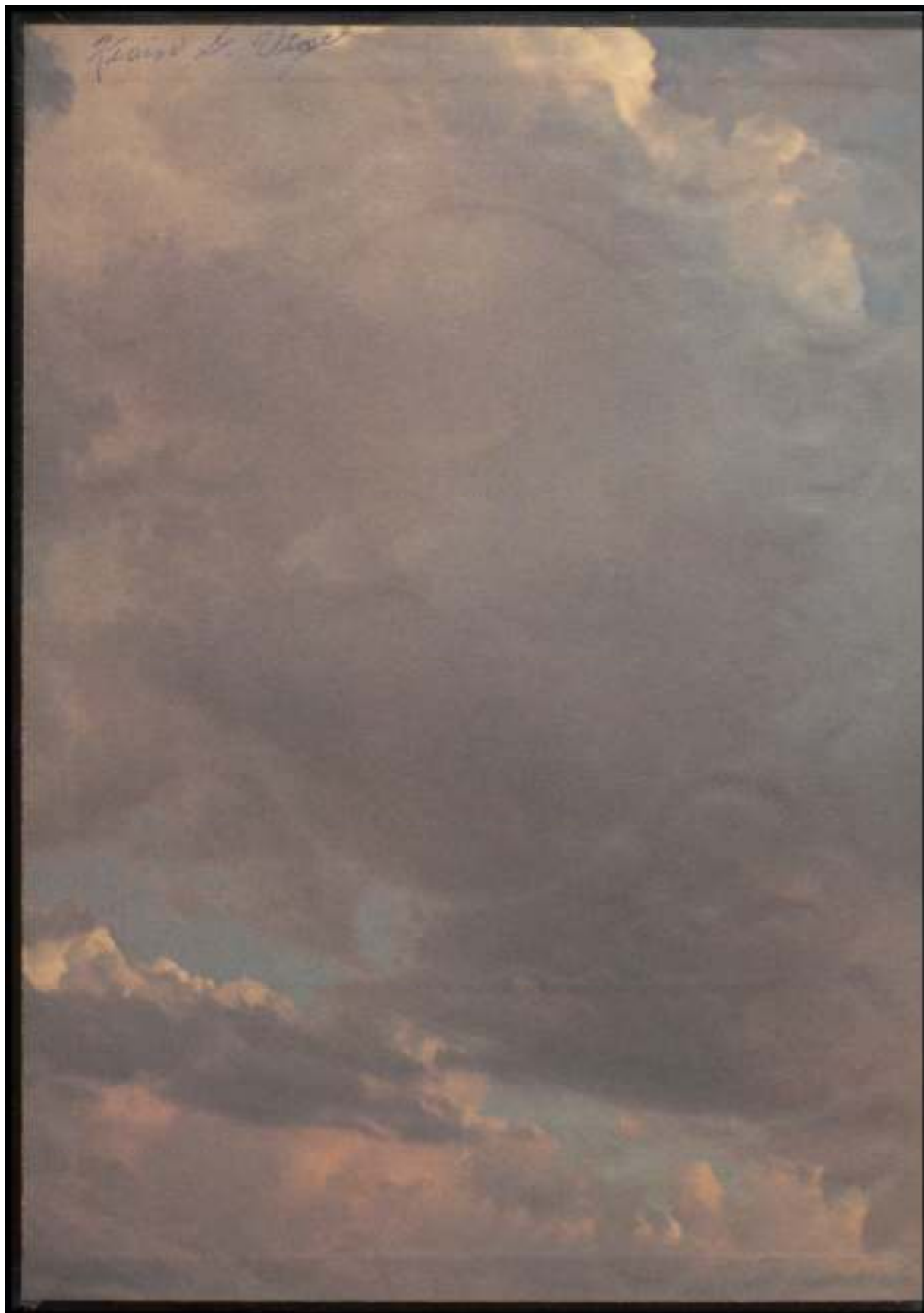

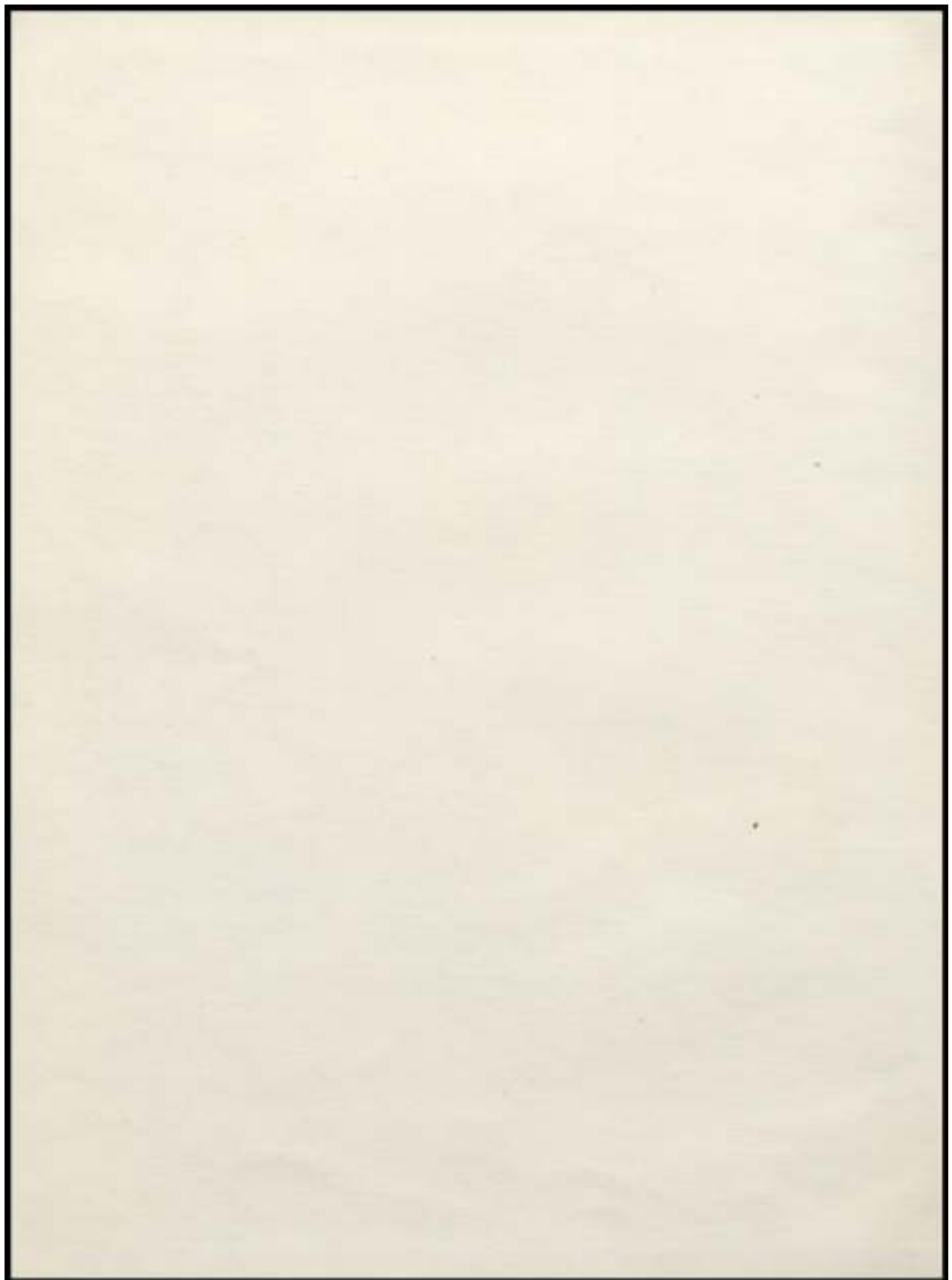

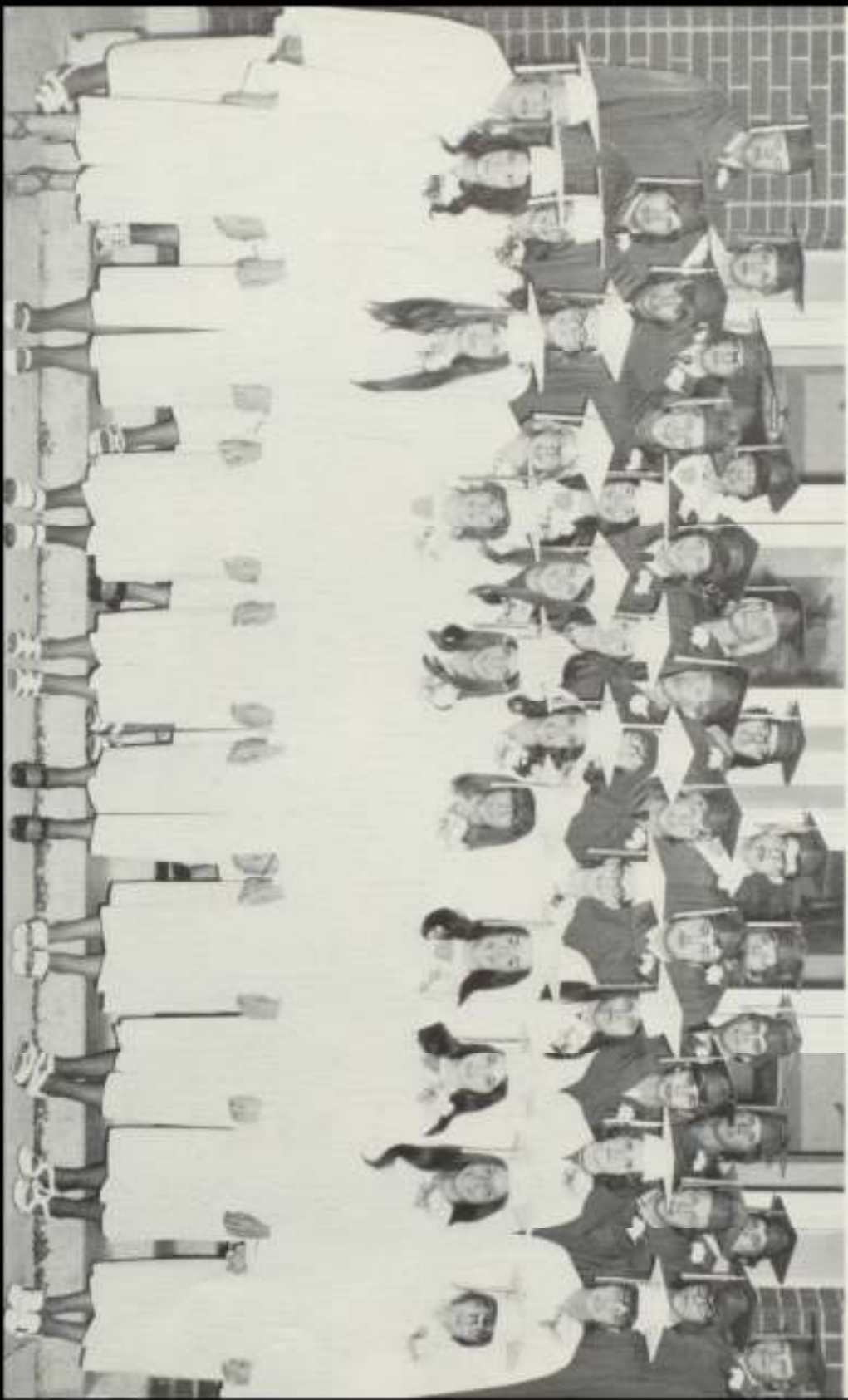

The battery of Cindy Hankins and Patty Jacobson, plus the tough defense of the team, led by second-baseman, Sue Christensen, and center-fielder, Deb Pentico, allowed the opponents only 2.5 runs per game. The offensive power was provided by Peity, Kathy Cran, Sue, Cindy, and Kathy Wendt, who led the team to a .308 batting average. Twin Rivers can be proud of the girls' accomplishments. They have set high standards for future teams of our school to strive to match. This was possible because of the fine ability of the girls, and their spirit and dedication to the team.

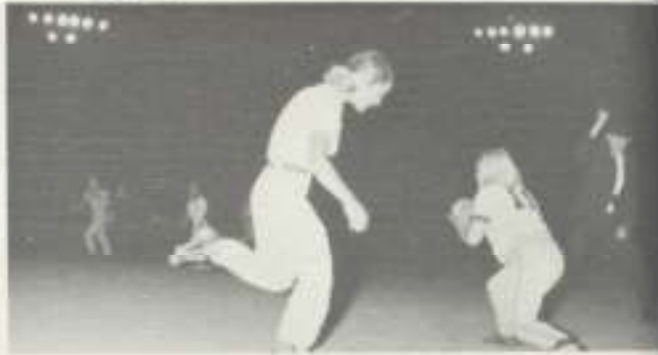

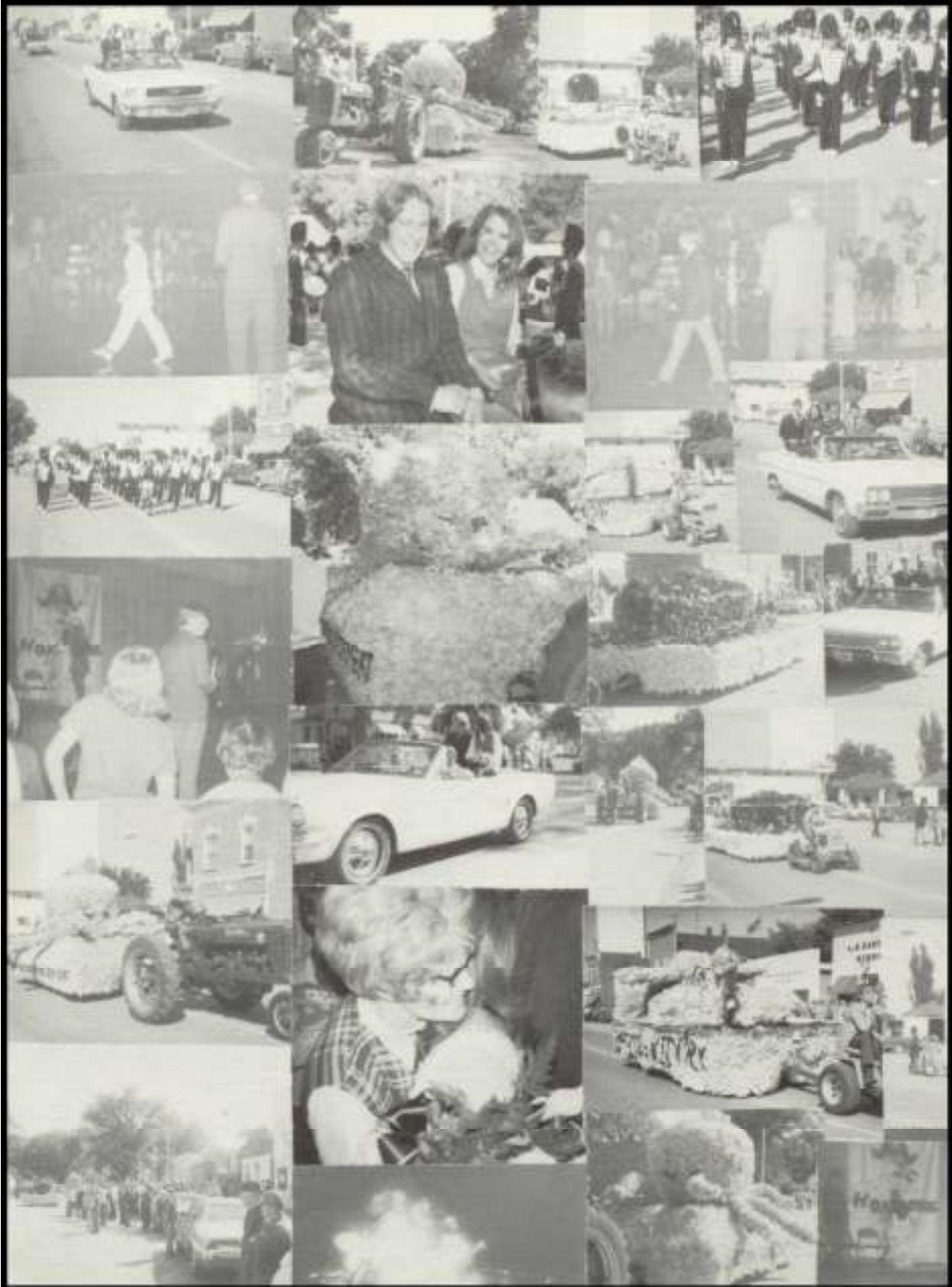
