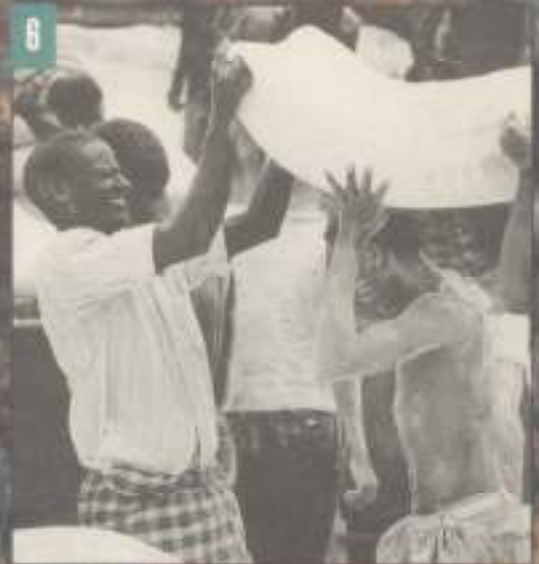
4 Madonna dominated the media promoting a movie, a book and an album. The Material Girl managed a record \$80 million deal with Time Warner to form her own multimedia company.
